#### Foreword by the chaplain

The Psalms form the only book of the Bible which we hear at every celebration of the Eucharist. From the earliest days they have been central to private and public worship of Christians, as they had been for the Jewish People, including Our Lord. Within these one hundred and fifty prayers, we find every expression of human sorrow and joy, fear of the Lord and confidence in his faithfulness. St. John Fisher wrote that, 'the holy psalms are like letters of supplication that we can give to almighty God as helpful movers and stirrers of [His] infinite mercy toward us....' (Sermon on Psalm 37).

Within the Mass, each Responsorial Psalm has been chosen to chime with the First Reading. Its recitation allows us to go more deeply into the Word of God and respond to what we have heard. It is worthy of our attention and appreciation.

'The singing of the Psalm, or even of the response alone, is a great help toward understanding and meditating on the Psalm's spiritual meaning' (General Introduction to the Lectionary, 21. Therefore, with the introduction of the English Standard Version - Catholic Edition Bible for use at Holy Mass, James Bibey and his collaborators have done us a great service by setting to music the new translation of the Psalms. Their work allows us to respond to God's Word and sing His praises. We owe them a great debt.

#### **Fisher House Catholic Chaplaincy**

Fisher House is the home of the Catholic Chaplaincy to the University of Cambridge. The chaplaincy has ministered to students and other Catholics in Cambridge since 1895, and has been at its current site on Guildhall Street since 1924.



The Chaplaincy has a thriving musical tradition, with 2 separate choirs for the Sunday Masses, and a 3<sup>rd</sup> choir singing at weekday events. This psalter has been written for the Sunday English Mass.

#### The editor



James Bibey, at time of writing, serves as the organist and director of the Chapel Choir at Fisher House. James has been singing psalms in church from the age of 8, when his local church's music group invited him to sing. He is a tenor and past choral scholar of the Chapel Choir of Downing College, Cambridge, and supports the chaplaincy's music alongside his degree in clinical medicine. The Fisher Psalter is the first major published musical work that James has produced.

## The psalter

This psalter has been written to produce psalms in line with the new translation of the lectionary (the Abbey Psalter) recommended by the Liturgy Office of England and Wales for start in 2024. The psalter incorporates psalms by many composers, particularly Catholic composers with an association with Cambridge. It includes some of the spirit and variety of the Cambridge Catholic community.

The psalter is comprehensive for every Sunday, feast, and major solemnity. A handful of days have multiple psalms composed. The psalms contained here all have a short, single response that is singable by a congregation in a responsorial style. A keyboard accompaniment suitable for both organ and piano is included. The editor has also composed a new psalm chant for every major and minor key.

The music in this psalter is published under a Creative Commons Attribution 4.0 International (CC BY 4.0) licence, allowing for the music to be shared and adapted as long as appropriate credit is given. ## The composers

I am indebted to all the other composers of the psalter, who have helped to bring originality, variety, and above all a love of the texts to the new translations. Contributors have varied in their level of experience, from people for whom this is their first time writing a responsorial psalm or having work published, all the way to professional composers and musicians.

**Ashleigh Bridges** has attended Fisher House for many years, singing in both the Chapel Choir and the Schola Cantorum. A graduate of the University, he is an established composer in his own right, writing for the popular video game Old School RuneScape.

**Fr. Dominic White OP** is the Prior at Blackfriars, London, but before this was a pillar of the Dominican community in Cambridge. He has served as Acting Director of Research at the Margaret Beaufort Institute of Theology in Cambridge. He is both a talented composer and organist, and an alumnus of the university here.

**Lorenzo Bennett** has been an enormous support to liturgy within Cambridge. A gifted and diligent organist, he has supported organ playing at Fisher House, OLEM, and as the organ scholar at his college (Homerton). A graduate of the music degree, he now continues supporting the music ministry in Catholic parishes in London.

**Louisa Denby** is Director of Music at Downing College, Cambridge; she also lectures and supervises students across the University, and runs the Intercollegiate Choral Awards Scheme, including the new Choral Foundation Scheme. For ten years she was Director of Chapel Music & Organist at St. Edmund's College - Oxbridge's only college with a Roman Catholic Foundation. Outside Cambridge, she is in demand as a bassoonist, conductor, and animateur, and has a major role as CEO & Artistic Director of the National Youth Wind Orchestra.

**Dr. Angela Bennett** sang alto in the Fisher House Schola Cantorum and played the cello in the Folk Choir. She now sings regularly in the choirs at OLEM parish and has rejoined the Fisher House Chapel Choir. She still plays cello, both classical and folk. She is a local GP and medical educator.

**Felix Bennett** is a Year 8 student at St. Bede's school in Cambridge. He comes to Fisher House with his parents. He is a senior chorister at Jesus College and plays the violin and folk fiddle.

**Cathy Ryland** is a friend and confidente who has been a not-infrequent deputy singer at Fisher House even as she studies veterinary medicine elsewhere. She is an accomplished singer, previously a chorister and Canon's Scholar at Llandaff Cathedral, and currently serving at Guildford Cathedral.

**Lachlan Rooney** may be better known to those familiar with him at the chaplaincy as a dedicated altar server and sacristan, but also has been able to contribute to this psalter from his other musical and compositional experiences. He studies Physics at Selwyn College.

**Ruth Pavey** is a member of the Chapel Choir at Fisher House, and an experienced singer and musician. She is studying for a PGCE at Peterhouse College.

**Anne Bibey**, my mum, is one of two people who really introduced me to psalm-singing. She is a thoughtful composer of melody. She is an experienced instrumental musician in church, and sings and helps to direct the choir at my home parish in Cardiff.
